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The Effect of Faculty of Physical Education and Sport Science Programs' on Student's Attitude towards Physical Activity

ABSTRACT

The purpose of this study was to investigate the effect of faculty of physical education and sport science programs on students' attitudes toward sport activity; a second goal was to investigate the influence of the college curriculum and programs on their attitudes. Students' attitude towards sport and physical activity was conducted using KENYON's scale of attitude toward physical activity. The scale was developed in 1968 and designed to measure attitude towards six sub domains of physical activity, physical activity as a social experience, physical activity for health and fitness, Physical activity as the pursuit of vertigo, physical activity as an aesthetic experience, physical activity as catharsis, and physical activity as ascetic experience.

The sub-domains described above were investigated and the results reveal that the students have positive attitude towards five sub-domains and negative attitude towards one sub-domain of the scale which was physical activity as an ascetic experience. Physical activities as ascetic experience include activities requiring long strenuous and often painful training and tough competition with deferment of other gratifications. Furthermore, we found no positive influence of the college curriculums on students' attitude toward physical activity and/or sport. This phenomenon needs further investigation.
