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**Criticizing the Narrations Related to the Cause of Descendence of the Verse
(Ye Who Believe, If a Wicked Person Comes to You with News...)**

ABSTRACT

This paper aims to collect all narrations of Hadith in order to understand why Allah said this verse “ye who believe , if a wicked person comes to you with news, ascertain the truth lest ye harm people unwillingly , and afterwards become full of repentance for what ye have done ” related to the Sahabi Alwalid bin Oqba bin Abi Mui.

It will be studied regarding the narrators and the Hadith text.

It is obvious that the narrators' reportings are unreliable and could be considered a good deed regarding the problem that lies in the reportings of these unreliable narrations from a historic point of view, or because of differences in those narrations.
